The Youth and Young Adult Choir at my church sings a song which is so appropriate for this time. The words


> It's a new day, a new year I'm so happy you are here Many thought I wouldn't make it Thank God I made it over Yes I did

- 2. Ask God for the strength to make it through and overcome the challenges that may arise in the years to come.


