honor of Triumphant Soror Sharon K. Harvey. THZ plans to award two scholarships in March 2006 during their Finer Womanhood luncheon.



Sorority participates in Zeta Prematurity Weekend

Zetas throughout the region in taking part in prematurity awareness events Nov. 11-13. Sorors in more than 600 communities in the U. S. conducted Prematurity Awareness activities in their houses of worship. This is the third consecutive year of Zeta’s participation in the event. To date, more than 250,000 people in 40 states and the U.S. Virgin Islands have participated.

Prematurity affects one out of eight babies born in the U.S. today—a rate that has increased 29 percent since 1981. The numbers are even more alarming for African-American babies who have a one- in-six chance of being born too soon. During 2000-2002 in Maryland, preterm birth rates were highest for black infants (16.9%), followed by Native Americans (12.0%), Hispanics

(11.7%), whites (10.8%) and Asians (9.9%).

In addition to the emotional toll, there is a tangible cost to premature birth as well. Average hospital charges in the United States for the most severe cases of prematurity were nearly 60 times higher than the charges for newborn stays without complications. Prematurity is the leading cause of newborn death (in the first month of life) and many of those babies who survive leave the hospital with lifelong health conditions or developmental disabilities that will place additional financial burden on the family.

The March of Dimes is in the third year of a five-year, \$75 million national campaign to educate women to support research into the causes of premature birth, and to educate the public and health

professionals about this escalating health problem.

Despite its prevalence, many families endure the trauma of a premature birth, and all too often infant death, privately and silently. Most people are unaware of the scope of this common and costly health problem

The March of Dimes is a national voluntary health agency whose mission is to improve the health of babies by preventing birth defects and infant mortality.

Founded in 1938, the March of Dimes funds programs of research, community services, education, and advocacy to save babies and in 2003 launched a five-year campaign to address the increasing rate of premature birth. For more information, visit the March of Dimes Web site at:
