The Innterim House is a safe haven for women and children. Residents are assisted with moving forward after experiencing set backs in life.



When I say... "I am a Christian" I'm not trying to be strong. I'm professing that I'm weak And need His strength to carry on.


When I say... "I am a Christian" I'm not bragging of success. I'm admitting I have failed And need God to clean my mess.
